July is BIPOC Mental Health Month. BIPOC National Mental Health Month was established in 2008 to recognize the unique struggles that underrepresented groups face in regard to mental illness. The 2022 theme for the month is Beyond the Numbers. "While there are stories of resilience born out of oppression, persecution, and abuse, there is immeasurable strength in each of these cultures. In an increasingly diversified America, we acknowledge the specificity of individual and group experiences and how it relates to their beliefs and well-being." Mental Health America

Every day, people of color experience far more subtle traumas:


- People who avoid them and their neighborhoods out of ignorance and fear;

On July 16th three digit number (988) will go live nationwide for callers in distress. 988 will be available 24/7 for calls, to text, or to chat with all calls directed to trained counselors. One goal of this program is to reduce the number of tragic deaths that can occur when the police are called during a mental health crisis. Los Altos has posted its draft Housing Element for public review. The Public Review Comment period (30 days from posting) will close on July 24th. Planning and Building will present this draft to City Council at the July 12th meeting.
